Nationally:

- •12,000-56,000 estimated deaths were attributed to influenza
- •140,000-710,000 estimated hospitalizations were attributed to influenza
- •9,200,000-35,600,000 estimated cases of influenza

2016-2017 Influenza Season

In Kansas:

- •99 deaths were directly attributed to influenza
- •54% were among those 85 years or older
- •44 influenza outbreaks were investigated

Healthy People 2020 Goals

- Increase the percentage of people aged 6 months and older that receive an annual flu shot to 70%.
- •Increase the percentage of health care workers who receive an annual flu shot to 90%.
- Increase the percentage of pregnant women who are vaccinated against seasonal influenza to 80%.



2016-2017 Influenza Season

Nationally:

- •An estimated 46.8% of people 6 months of age and older received an influenza vaccination.
- •An estimated 78.6% of health care workers received an influenza vaccination.
- An estimated 53.6% of pregnant women received an influenza vaccination.




2016-2017 Influenza Season

In Kansas:


- •An estimated 43.9% of people 6 months of age and older received an influenza vaccination.
- •An estimated 93.2% of health care workers received an influenza vaccination.
- •Information on vaccination rates of pregnant women in Kansas not available for the 2016-2017 influenza season.
