- Called to order by: Charlie Hunt
- IKC model school immunization policy impact project
 - MPH student Jeni McDonald started her field experience with KHI, and this will be her primary project
 - KDHE school nurse survey
- Questions regarding IKC model vaccination exclusion policy, which was disseminated in July 2016, are being added to this year's KDHE school nurse survey
 - Survey is being conducted among public school district health coordinators as well as private schools
 - Questions to be added will assess any adoption or changes in vaccination policies at district level as well as details about current policies and practices
 - Survey will go out early February
 - KDHE Institutional Review Board is considering project today
 - NOTE: KDHE IRB has conditionally approved the project as being exempt, subject to documentation of how data will be transmitted from KDHE to KHI
 - Report anticipated by end of spring semester
- College and university model vaccine policy
 - No work has been done on this
- Meningococcal vaccine mandate
 - KDHE plans to move forward with administrative regulations requiring age-appropriate meningococcal vaccine for adolescents in Kansas schools
 - This will be discussed at the general IKC meeting today
- Revisions to KDHE administrative regulations regarding disease control
 - Discussed changes in vaccine-preventable disease issues, including changes in post-exposure vaccination requirements
 - February 21: public hearing scheduled

- Administration of a drug by prescription bill
 - Dean giving testimony on February 13
 - Allows pharmacists to administer medications by prescription; will help pharmacists be able to administer vaccinations
- Pharmacists and expanded scope of practice regarding vaccinations
 - Since July 1, 2017 at Dillons pharmacies
 - 65 doses of non-flu vaccines for ages 12-17
 - 2% of total vaccines given
 - 1,644 for flu doses for kids 6-17
 - > 5% of total vaccines given
