IKC IMMUNIZE KANSAS COALITION

The Immunize Kansas Coalition (IKC) is a group of Kansas providers, health department officials, researchers, educators, healthcare payers, associations, nonprofits, vaccine producers, school nurses, pharmacists, parents, grandparents and more working together to improve vaccine rates and protect Kansans against vaccine-preventable diseases.

MOST Kansans believe vaccines are important, but a very small, vocal minority of adults want childhood vaccination to be optional. IKC believes this would be as dangerous as allowing people to treat traffic signals as optional.

Freedom is very important to all of us, but the safety of individuals in our community depends on a balance between rights and responsibilities.

Treating childhood vaccines as optional would be as dangerous as allowing people to treat traffic signals as optional.

These infections have serious consequences. The notion that these diseases are "mild" is medically inaccurate. Vaccine-preventable diseases cause permanent consequences such as paralysis, limb amputation, hearing loss, blindness, seizures, brain damage, and death.

Prevention is better than treatment. We have medicine to treat some vaccine-preventable diseases (e.g., pertussis), but not most (e.g., mumps, diphtheria, polio). Some bacteria and viruses have developed resistance to medicines.

U.S. vaccine safety standards are high. Before being licensed in the U.S., scientists, doctors, and the federal government carefully review the data to make sure they're safe. The FDA licenses vaccines only after randomized controlled trials; then there is continuous monitoring after licensure. Standards are high because vaccines are given to healthy people.

If every parent exempted their child from vaccination, these diseases would return to Kansas in full force.

Let's keep improving, not go backwards. For each disease, you see the difference between the number of people in the U.S. who became sick per year before the vaccine versus in 2022.

Vaccines save lives. We know that vaccines have eliminated or dramatically reduced the incidence of many infectious diseases. Experts around the world agree on this. In the U.S., giving children born in a single year all routine vaccines can prevent 42,000 early deaths and 20 million cases of disease. ¹ Vaccines also save money. **Every \$1 spent on childhood vaccines saves \$10.²**

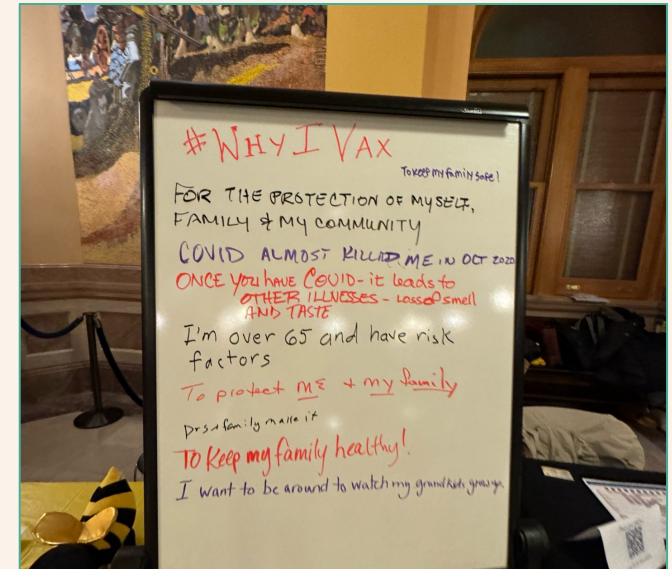

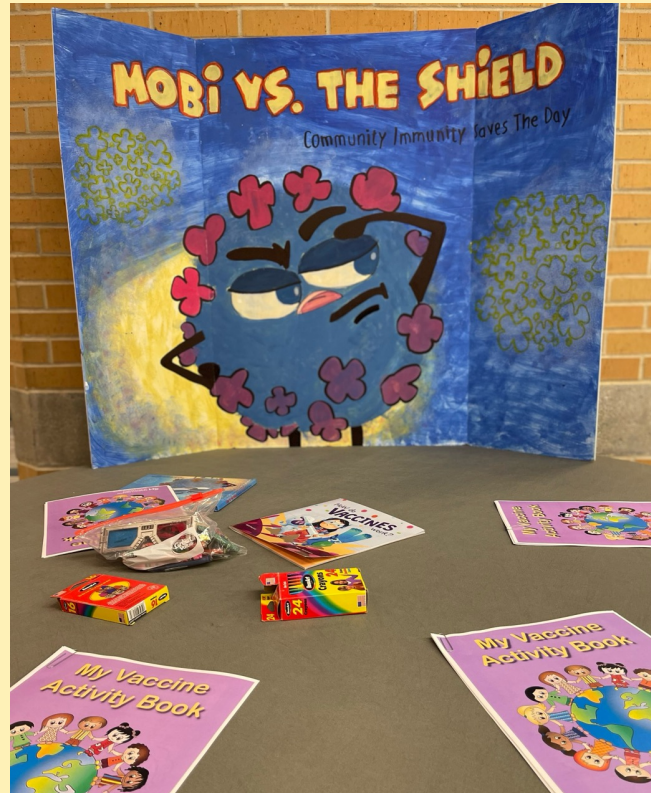

Why the change from 317 to VFC?

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is sunsetting the Hepatitis B Birth Dose Program due to the available funds through the VFC Program. The 317 funds will no longer be available for use for pediatric intent.

Good News!

Because of this change, Kansas VFC enrolled hospitals will now be able to provide both Hepatitis B and Nirsevimab doses to VFC eligible infants.

- The KSWebIZ Patient Portal is anticipated to launch during the 3rd or 4th quarter.
- The Portal will use a 2-factor authentication method and will utilize text messages or emails.
 - The record must be sent to the patient.
- KIP is currently working with our vendor on some data issues.
 - Multiple providers have entered the provider email address and phone number into patient records. Because of this, multiple patients now have the same email and phone number.

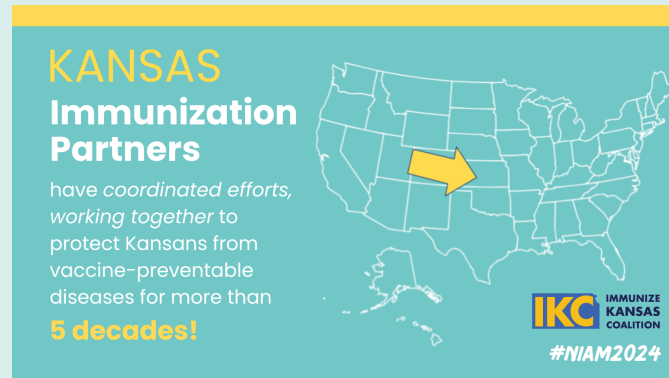
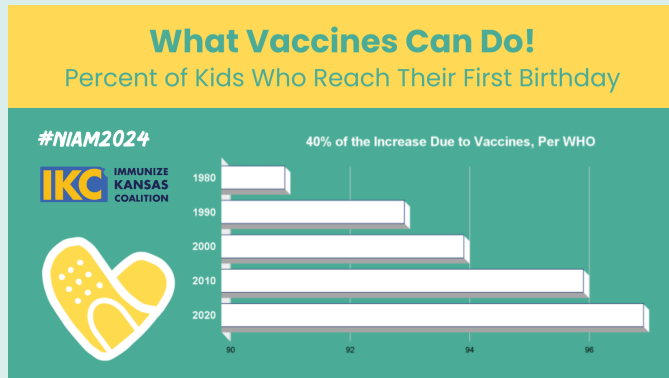

What is Flu (Influenza)?

Flu is a contagious respiratory virus caused by influenza viruses that infects the nose, throat, and sometimes the lungs.

What is RSV?

RSV usually causes mild, cold-like symptoms. Most people recover in a week or two, but RSV can be serious, especially for babies and older adults.

What is COVID-19?

COVID-19 can be very contagious and spreads quickly. Most people with COVID-19 have mild symptoms, but some people can become severely ill.

What are the Symptoms?

If you have symptoms of a respiratory virus, there are tests that can help determine which virus you may have and inform your treatment and prevention actions, like physical distancing and mask use.

Stay Protected with Vaccines!

Flu:

Seasonal flu vaccine is recommended for **everyone over 6 months** (with rare exceptions).

RSV

Protecting Babies:

- RSV vaccine given during pregnancy; if **32–36 weeks pregnant during September–January**
- RSV antibody immunization **recommended for some infants during or entering RSV season**, after talking with their healthcare provider.

Protecting Older Adults:

- RSV vaccine for **adults over 60 years of age**, after talking with their healthcare provider

COVID-19

Those **6 months and older** should stay **up-to-date** with recommended COVID-19 vaccines.

CDC's Bridge Access Program provides **no-cost COVID-19 vaccines** to adults without health insurance and adults whose health plans don't cover all costs.
