Geovannie Gone shared IKC's highlights and accomplishments during the past year, showcasing IKC's Annual Report.



Special Presentation: Immunization Community Partner

Jared Holroyd, Executive Director, Kansas Pharmacists Association



During the Special Presentation session, Jared Holroyd from the <u>Kansas Pharmacists</u> <u>Association (KPhA)</u> shared about their mission and work with IKC.

Some of these included:

- IKC x KSRE's Get Caught Up campaign is displayed and available in many KPhA pharmacies.
- The University of Kansas' School of Pharmacy partnered with IKC, KFMC, and KDHE during the <u>collegiate flu campaign</u> to provide outreach to KU students.

He also reminded attendees that outreach can be assisted by pharmacists and pharmacies and encouraged partnership with KPhA or a local pharmacy to maximize efforts.

KDHE Kansas Immunization Program Report

- The CDC is sunsetting the <u>Bridge Access Program</u> in August, no specific date has been shared.
- The Hepatitis B Birth Dose Program in Kansas will be sunsetted in the fall due to an end in funding.
- Kansas VFC hospitals that are enrolled will now be able to provide both the RSV immunization and the Hepatitis B vaccination to VFC-eligible newborns.
- Kansas WebIZ will offer a patient portal so that patients can enter the system to attain their immunization record.

Strategic Team Summaries









Policy:

- Please promote back-to-school and pro-vaccine messaging, as there are outreach campaigns contrary to IKC's mission targeting school nurses and administrators. Find resources on our <u>NIAM webpage</u>.
- The landscape of Kansas vaccine policy for the upcoming session is unknown due to many changes in the legislature. We will know more by early December.
- Save the Date: IKC Advocacy Day on January 30th

Health Equity:

- The Health Equity team discussed the importance of continuing to create diverse resources in multiple languages that are culturally competent to community needs.
- The team also talked about focusing on underserved adult populations.

Improved Systems Performance:

- The Improved Systems Performance (ISP) team's role has changed post-COVID. The focus has shifted from antigen-specific targets to broader data system improvement, monitoring, and usage opportunities.
- The team also discussed creating an Annual Data Report to help improve engagement rates and encourage conversations around current vaccines and preventable diseases.
- The <u>Kansas Fights Flu Collegiate Challenge</u> is kicking off again this fall with numerous colleges participating.
- KFMC and an IKC Community Health Specialist successfully moved a long-term care facility from 0% of residents up-to-date on COVID-19 vaccines to 68% through conversations to answer questions and increase vaccine confidence!

Education & Awareness:

- The new E&A Team Chair, Elizabeth Morris, BSN, RN, CPN, and Co-Chair, Stephania Lopez, BS, shared about themselves and how they look forward to leading the committee.
- IKC's education modules continue to be reviewed and updated. Check them out!
